Eligibility

F	<p>You are a foreign tourist visiting Japan from abroad for sight-seeing, under the entry status of "temporary visitor." Temporary Visitor entry status, according to Japanese Immigration Law, allows a stay in Japan of 15 days or 90 days for "sight-seeing, etc." If you apply for a "stay for sight-seeing" when you enter Japan, entry personnel will stamp your passport as "Temporary Visitor," as shown below. *In order to receive or use JAPAN RAIL PASS, your passport must bear this stamp or sticker. *If you use an automated gate, no stamp will be applied to your passport. Either use a manned automated gate or ask a clerk to apply the stamp to your passport.</p> 
J	<p>You are a Japanese national living outside of Japan who meets the following conditions. <<This regulation will be withdrawn for MCOs issued on/after 01APR17. MCOs issued on/before 31MAR17 will be eligible for exchange by 30JUN17>></p> <p>a. who has the right of permanent residence in that country. b. who is married to a non-Japanese residing in a country other than Japan. Japanese Passport-Holder with Permanent Residence in the Following Countries/Territories are Recognized by JR:

Asia: Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, China, Hong Kong, Philippines, Malaysia, Macao

Oceania: Australia, New Zealand, Northern Marianas (Saipan), American Samoa

Europe: UK, Estonia, The Netherlands, Croatia, San Marino, Switzerland, Sweden, Spain, Slovakia, Slovenia, Czech Republic, Germany, Norway, Hungary, Finland, Lithuania, Italy

Africa: Namibia

Things to Be Careful of When Issuing an MCO

- 1 Check the passenger's eligibility for a pass. Note that the eligibility is not the same for every pass.
- 2 Check the amount shown is correct (e.g. 38,880 not 38,800) and that the amount matches the pass type. Incorrect amounts are a top cause of problems.
- 3 Make sure everything is spelt correctly as JR staff will check every letter for accuracy, e.g. Raul Pass instead of Rail Pass.
- 4 Make sure the validation stamp shows through to all copies of the MCO. This is another top cause of problems.
- 5 Make sure the writing is legible on all copies of the MCO. This is another big issue for JR as sometimes they cannot read the MCO because of poor writing or failure to ensure enough pressure is applied.
- 6 Make sure the passenger is given the exchange coupon (do not mis-lift). If the passenger does not have the exchange coupon they will be denied a rail pass in Japan.
